My name is Chloe Schmidt and I am a student currently completing my second year in the Elementary Education Program at the University of Victoria. I want to thank you for the opportunity to become apart your classroom, and your willingness to support my individual growth and learning over the course of my first practicum.

To tell you a bit about myself, including relevant skills and experience, this past year I took on a tutoring role, helping a girl in grade eight develop an improved comprehension of math and a more positive association with it. Additionally, I have fond memories from this summer acting as a nanny to two boys aged seven and eight, where I was able to practice assertiveness, patience, and problemsolving, as well as and perhaps most importantly, have fun.
